



The Hiddenness of God



One of the benefits of our new lighting system in church is that we can at last get a good view of our marvellous nave roof. Our brightly coloured chancel roof shouts its presence at us but the nave one has been hidden away in the gloom. That's a shame because it's very old and beautiful. Like most of the present church, it goes back 600 years to the early fifteenth century and time of the Battle of Agincourt. Of course it's been repaired many times, but the main cross beams are original. If you look carefully at them, you can see the marks of the axes that were used to shape them out of tree trunks.

Hiddenness is a recurring theme in the Bible. In the Old Testament, Elijah finds God not in the earthquake or the wind, but in the "still small voice". Jesus urges his followers to keep quiet about what they're seeing and tells those being healed not to spread their stories about. Even the Resurrection itself takes place behind the stone that seals off the tomb in the Garden.

God works so often, not in the big headlines of life, but in the small ordinary things, the things we take for granted. May he open our eyes to see him, our ears to hear him and our lips to acknowledge all that he does day by day in our lives.

Easingwold Foodshare News

A formal branch of Hambleton Foodshare is now close to being a reality in the Easingwold & Villages area. A number of local people have come forward as volunteers and together we will improve our help to those local people in need. Further details of our drop in centre in Easingwold will be included next month. Providing food aid on the one hand means that we will rely on others will donate food or funds to help us. Look for food donation points soon in local supermarkets - it is also our aim to have a food donation box shortly in most of the churches in our area. Food Banks are a natural place for us as Archbishop Welby recently affirmed and a way to show the outside world what being a Christian stands for.

The sad fact is that there are indeed households and families in poverty among us and often find themselves without food or money. Choices such as "Do we put money in the meter to keep warm, or do we feed the children?" are common. That can be the stark dilemma in some local homes. Children have no say as to where they were born and who in this day and age, should not be expected to suffer!

In the households we have assisted so far with Food Aid in the Easingwold area, common factors are emerging:

Most involve children and Mums not eating (or at least skipping meals) to help feed them

Many of them also involve a temporary crisis or are waiting the 6 weeks for benefits to arrive which has tipped them over the edge.

In the majority of cases I have dealt with, the recipients are very reluctant, embarrassed and ashamed to accept help - some particularly so; very far removed from the "Benefits' Street" image that the media would want you to believe.
