

### From the Vicar



## "When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest."

Leviticus 199

Many of you will have read the Book of Ruth in the Old Testament. It is a story of how a young widow, Ruth, chooses to stay with her new mother-in-law, Naomi, rather than going back to her own family. Both Naomi and Ruth were widows, Naomi has lost her husband and both her sons and Ruth has lost her husband. Life would have been extremely difficult for the pair of them and Ruth could have taken the easy option of going back home to restart her life. Instead, Ruth and Naomi fend for themselves.

Ruth went out to find food for the pair of them. She went to the fields and gathered some of the gleanings (the remains of the crops that wasn't picked up in the first harvest). The collected grain was ground into flour and bread was made. She and Naomi survived on this and eventually good fortune came their way and Ruth married Boaz, a distant relation of Naomi's.

If the farmer had insisted on going back and seeing how much more grain the workers could harvest if they went back a second time then Ruth and Naomi could have starved to death. It was because of the good nature of the farmers that many people survived.

We are fortunate enough to live in times when we don't have to follow on from those who are harvesting so that we can gather the grain to make bread; but, unfortunately, we do need foodbanks. Any collection of money or donations of food collected in church goes to people who need it.

This year, at Easingwold, we are collecting food (non perishable) for EDDCA and money for York Carecent. Carecent may ask for specific items, these will be put in the fortnightly email and the weekly pew-sheet when we know what they require. Raskelf's harvest service is on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October at 7.00pm when money collected there will go to the farmers' benevolent fund, RABI.

Harvest is a time of year not just to thank the farmers for their hard work and to thank God for what He provides, but also to think about how we use the harvest for the good of others; are we sharing our resources wisely? Are we treating our animals with the respect which they deserve as through their life they are giving us life? What about our land and our gardens? Is a beautifully manicured garden really the best thing for the bees and insects, or is it part of our human pride, with us wanting the perfect garden without weeds? As Christians it is our responsibility to look after all of God's creatures, animals, humans and the insects. Looking after the insects and animals means fertilized crops and happier animals which, in turn, means better food for us.

Ruth and Naomi had to rely on the charity of the farmers; there are some people who will be relying on us, at one of the bleakest times in their lives, for food or some sort of help. Most of us are extremely lucky that we can buy what we need, and probably more than we need. Harvest is a time to think of where our food and provisions come from and how, in turn, we use them and enable others to share in what we have.

It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out.

After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards!

In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!

Perhaps, give it a try? Join us, you are most welcome.

### Widows' Group

Many of us will face the enormity of losing our husbands, often after many years of marriage, and although we know that it is inevitable, the force of it can be soul destroying and leave us feeling lonely and uncertain about our futures.

This happened to me in December last year. It is hard to explain to anyone who has not experienced such a loss, what it is like. Even with a supportive family and many supportive friends, I still felt as though I had been cast adrift on waters I did not feel competent to manage.

The one group of people who understood what I was going through were those who had experienced it themselves. With them I felt I could talk openly about things that were worrying me even if it was something trivial. They were also able to talk openly about the loved one they had lost and that opened up for me the opportunity to talk about John.

It is with all this in mind that I am offering to start a group where we can come together to discuss the issues which losing a partner raises. It doesn't matter if your widowhood is recent, or well into the past. Loneliness can get worse the older we get. We need to feel we have a safe place where we can express our worries, concerns and needs, and hopefully we can create a group to which we can turn for help if that is needed.

We can meet in church, at the house where I live, or in a local cafe. We can decide at our first meeting how often we would like to meet, and also see how many people are interested.

Looking round our church, there are many people living on their own and many are grieving and needing support.

I hope you will be able to come to a first exploratory meeting to be held in church after the 10.30 service on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> October.
