

*From the Vicar ...*



By the time that this goes on the website, we will probably still be following self-isolation and social distancing when outside. It has been very difficult for some people, not seeing anyone for days on end with shopping being left on the doorstep. For others, there have been the trials of living with someone that you find difficult, it may be a child, a parent or a partner but there is nowhere to escape to, especially if where your living space is small.

It is easy to think of the negative things that we have from this. There are the obvious positives; that we all want to stay healthy and we don't want to pass on the virus on to anyone else. But there are other positives. For many of us it will mean that we have more time on our hands, time to get into the garden and make it look better than it has on any other previous year. Our houses are shining as they are spring cleaned daily. We can have long chats on the phone to our friends and not feel guilty that we should be doing something else. We read all of the newspaper instead of just the headlines. We also have the opportunity to improve our spiritual life. We can study that Scripture that we promised ourselves in Lent, but something got in the way. We can turn our thoughts more to God in prayer.

During this time of lockdown we can complain, but we can also think about and thank God for all the good things that we have; excellent families, or neighbours and friends who have helped us through it all. We can thank God for listening to us and helping us with our daily needs such as shopping.

When life gets back to some sort of normality, I hope that we would have learnt something about ourselves, and about others, but hopefully we would have learnt something new and exciting about God too.

## ONLINE PARISH SERVICES

As we went into lockdown and the unprecedented closure of churches, our Vicar Margaret (supported by husband Tim) started to experiment with holding online services via the Zoom video-conferencing system. As a proof of concept, a small pioneering group were invited to join a Morning Prayers trial. The experiment was then extended to Compline during Holy Week. In spite of a few initial teething problems, which were overcome, everyone felt it was a success and the new online services were publicised just in time for Easter.

Starting with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday services, Margaret and Lottie have now held many services over Zoom, supported by various readers along with Peter Smith on the piano. The number of attendees is growing at an encouraging rate and everyone is enjoying the opportunity to meet and worship together.

# St John the Baptist Men's Group

The weather has been truly glorious of late, which is hopefully some comfort to all of those who are struggling with the rather bizarre world in which we find ourselves living today.

It has been some two months since the Men's Group from St John's were together for their March monthly meeting at The George in Market Place, and I recently sent the regulars from the group an email which included some thoughts and reflections to help them through these difficult times. I have included the content of that email below in case it is of interest to people more widely.

Many people will be finding life extremely hard in these days, particularly those who are suffering from COVID-19, those who face the direct responsibility of caring for them, and those who have suffered the loss of a close family member or friend; but it is also hard for those who are simply trying to deal with the effects of social isolation and the consequences of not working at the present time.

I am also sure that many Christians are finding it difficult with not being able to worship together, meet for fellowship, and offer on-going emotional support through a warm greeting, a hug, or holding the hand of another person who is going through difficulty. We have been extremely fortunate and greatly blessed with all the work that Rev'd Margaret has been doing to get our parishioners together through the use of online 'Zoom' services, where many people have been able to see each other and pass on greetings via that medium. And I think it would be important to acknowledge the immense amount of work that her husband, Tim, has put in to make this possible. If you weren't aware of these Sunday morning services, or haven't already accessed the online services and would like to do so, then do contact Margaret and she can then forward you details for the next Sunday morning's service.

The other great difficulty for the Christian is that deeply searching and mysterious question of: where is God in all this?

I was listening to an online talk the other day by the Rev Nicky Gumbel, who runs the extremely successful Church of Holy Trinity, Brompton, in Knightsbridge, London. Through Nicky's ministry that church has grown phenomenally and planted dozens of what might be described as 'lively younger generation churches' across the country. They have also developed a course known as 'Alpha' that has been run around the world and translated into some 117 languages. Holy Trinity, Brompton, would sit in the 'Charismatic Evangelical' stable in regards to their theology and churchmanship, and the online talk I refer to is from the last service at Holy Trinity before it closed for the 'Lockdown'. In it he talks about 'Choosing faith over fear' in the present situation, and it is certainly worth listening too if you want your faith encouraged and inspired. However for the deeper thinkers who want to try and delve a bit more into what scripture and theology has to say about God when we are going through tremendously difficult times of challenge and suffering, an article that I came across in Time Magazine might prove to be more enlightening. This article has been 'penned' by Tom Wright, Professor of New Testament and Early Christianity at St Mary's College in the University of St Andrews, and one time Bishop of Durham as some of you may know.

In the article he says: *"It is no part of the Christian vocation to be able to explain what's happening and why. In fact, it is part of the Christian vocation not to be able to explain - and to lament instead."*

# ZOOM

We are now using Zoom so that we can provide an online Sunday service for you. Many of you are already using it and it has been lovely to see you on a Sunday morning.

If you haven't taken the plunge yet and are worried that it will be difficult or that you will be bombarded with emails then don't worry. Tim and I will happily guide you through the process to setup Zoom and give you a practice session so that you can log on for a Sunday morning service.

All that you need to do is download the Zoom app onto your computer, tablet or smart phone. This can be done by going onto your search engine and typing in "Zoom meeting PC". If your computer uses Windows then click on "Download for Windows Zoom".

You will then be given the option to download from the App Store, if using an Apple device; or download from Google Play, if using an Android device. Click on the appropriate one for your computer/phone.

You will then be asked to install "Zoom Cloud Meeting" (the Zoom icon is a blue background with a white video camera)



You will need to create an account. It will ask you to enter your date of birth (this is only to confirm that you are over 18) followed by your email address and then choose a password. You will receive an email confirming your details and it will ask you to activate your account.

Once you have done this, you will be asked to enter your email and passwords to log onto Zoom. Your computer may ask if you want it to remember your password and, if no one else uses your computer, I would suggest clicking "yes".

Zoom will ask if it can use your camera or audio, so you will need to click on Yes/OK for it to work properly.

To keep things secure, each meeting has an ID code and a password. I will send these out a day or two before each Sunday. You will need to enter these numbers when requested.

Tim and I are happy to help you and have a practice session with you. Telephone me on 821394 if you need any help.

I know that other organisations are using Zoom because it allows you to see many people at once and I know of quite a few families who are using it for family quizzes, so I hope that if you do decide to use it, you will find it helpful in other situations.


