

## *From the Vicar*



**“You shall count off seven weeks of years, seven times seven years, so that the period of seven weeks of years gives forty-nine years. Then you shall have the trumpet sounded loud; on the tenth day of the seventh month—on the Day of Atonement—you shall have the trumpet sounded throughout all your land. And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family.”**

*Leviticus 25:8-10*

With Platinum Jubilee celebrations taking place within the Parish and around the country, it made me think about the Biblical Jubilee. The word comes from the Hebrew *jobel* which is translated as “ram’s horn”. The ram’s horn was used as a trumpet which was blown to start off the jubilee year. It would mark the end of seven weeks of years, i.e. the fiftieth year, for most people of the time, it would only happen once in their lifetime. The year would be a year when all the slaves were freed, debts erased and properties returned to families. The idea is that everything comes from God and because a family falls on hard times and needs to sell land (or have it taken from them) it does not mean that this debt should be held against them forever, so it was a time of great celebration.

If things were like this in 21<sup>st</sup> Century Britain, it would possibly rock the economy. Imagine owing money in the year before compared to the year after a jubilee. One would have all debts written off the following year, the other would have to wait 49 years. Also, what banks would want to lend money to someone if the debt was going to be written off the following year? Most of us use credit cards and manage our finances paying them off at the end of the month, but a jubilee would make finances very difficult to organise for many.

We still associate jubilee with celebration. I was at primary school when it was the Queen’s Silver Jubilee; we were all presented with a special coin. This year there is an abundance of ways of joining in the celebrations if one wishes.

For us in the Church of England, the Queen has been a person who has faith and is not afraid to admit it. She lives in a palace and financially she has more money than maybe all of us put together but how many of us would want her lifestyle? The childhood idea of marrying a prince as depicted in fairytales is not one that most of us would enjoy.

She has very publicly lived her life as a daughter, wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She has taken her duties seriously. Henry VIII was given the title of Defender of the Faith which has been passed down to each monarch. It is debatable the ways in which Henry carried out his duties but our Queen has been one of the best in history.

Seventy years on the throne is unlikely to be repeated for many centuries so it is an opportunity for celebration, it is an achievement that is unlikely to be repeated for centuries.
