"Mum, I'm going to be a minister when I grow up."

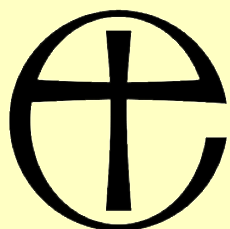
"Great," she replied, "what made you decide that?"

From Rev'd John Hetherington



Holidays from Hell! I'm sure you must have seen the programme that aired a few years ago. And if you've had a 'Holiday from Hell' yourself, then you have my deepest sympathy.

But isn't it true that at the end of a holiday some people find themselves looking back on glorious memories, while others will be regretting the choice of their holiday destination, or trying to recover from hours left in the lurch at airports or ferry terminals. Hope will usually triumph over experience, however, and by next January many of us will again be pouring over the brochures and planning our trip for 2026.

We shouldn't forget, however, that holidays were originally holy days, it's where the word comes from; and excursions were actually pilgrimages. Crowds would flock to shrines in the Holy Land, Assisi, Rome, Canterbury, and even Winchester – where they paid their respects to saints such as St Swithin, who believe it or not is Patron Saint of the Weather.

These pilgrimages were journeys with a purpose, travelling was long and hard, and the only resting place was often by the village well. Nowadays we complain if the meal on the aircraft isn't to our taste, or if the flight is delayed more than a few minutes. Whereas pilgrims allowed time for their journey, we want to be there immediately; after all, we're in a hurry with no time to waste. We rush from place-to-place taking photographs, but allow precious little time to really appreciate our new surroundings.

To a certain extent the same is true of our modern attitude to faith. Setting aside time to understand and explore our beliefs is very much a thing of the past for many people. We're into instant faith these days. If it doesn't work immediately then we simply don't bother to try again. We also enjoy '**Tasters**,' you know, a little bit of this and a little bit of that, but any thought of real commitment frightens us off. We become '**Faith Tourists**' for want of a better word, flitting from one attraction to another, never stopping long enough to explore anything in real depth.

Perhaps that's why children often find belief difficult to understand nowadays. They're no longer taken to church or Sunday Clubs by parents and yet they're taught about religion in school, which means they very easily become confused. Parents have their children baptised, but that's often as far as the commitment goes. And yet these same parents get very annoyed a few years later if they're unable to get their child into a Church school. What a very muddled message this all promotes!

I think the simple fact is that if you have the above attitude to faith, then one thing is fairly sure – you're probably a tourist and unlikely to be a pilgrim.

THE REV'D RICHARD GRANT HAS HEARD GOD'S CALL AND WILL BE OUR NEW VICAR.

The announcement that we have all been waiting for was made on Sunday 6th July when a letter from The Rt Rev'd Flora Winfield DD, Bishop of Selby was read out to the congregations at both Easingwold and Raskelf churches.

Bishop Flora begins:

"Dear Friends, You will be pleased to hear that the Reverend Richard Grant has accepted the offer to become Vicar of Easingwold with Raskelf in the Diocese of York."

She says of Richard's appointment:

"I am delighted that, after a period of prayerful discernment by the parish and the diocese, the Rev'd Richard Grant has responded to God's call to the appointment as Vicar of Easingwold and Raskelf. I will be praying for Richard and for his family, and for the churches and the parish. I look forward to welcoming Richard to the parish, and to working with them as they continue to grow together in faith, life and witness. I know that they will look forward together in confidence and hope, to seek new possibilities in all aspects of their life together and service in their communities, and to discover what it means to live out Christ's story in this place."

Rev'd Richard says of his appointment:

"I'm very much looking forward to taking up this role, to joining the churches of Easingwold and Raskelf in their mission to the parish, and to seeing what God has in store for us together. I have felt very much welcomed by those I've met so far, and am very excited to work with all in the parish as we seek God together and try to do his work.

At interview I had the opportunity to reflect on Jesus' words: 'You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others.' Those words have stuck with me as I have prayed since, and I'm excited to join the lights that shine in Easingwold and Raskelf and bring glory to God.

While an exciting new season awaits, I've had a fantastic curacy and it's sad to say goodbye to the benefice of Thirsk. I'm very grateful to the people of Thirsk, South Kilvington, Sandhutton and Carlton Miniott for all they have taught me during my time with them, and for the many joyful times we've shared. Despite moving on, they will remain in my prayers."

Happy Memories



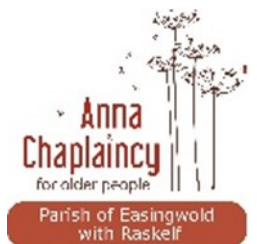

St. Mary's Restoration update

The documentation for faculty and planning applications is now complete. The detailed design has been finalised and the specification and schedule of works have been produced. The Statements of Significances and Needs have also been finalised. All the paperwork was submitted to the DAC by 4th July in preparation for their meeting on 22nd July.

If the DAC agree then a written notice is issued for a period of consultation. After the consultation period it then goes to the Chancellor. Once the faculty is issued it will go out to tender to conservation contractors for quotes.

The whole project has now been estimated at around £300/350k. It will be split into three areas but still under the one faculty. The Priority is the Tower and drainage. Preparation for an application to the Heritage Lottery fund will be begin once the faculty has been approved.

In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!

Our **charity boutique** on Long Street sells a selection of beautiful pre loved items, why not pop in and take a look.

For the men we have a **Men in Sheds** project based at the football club.

Delicious nutritious meals can be ordered via our **Meals on Wheels** service delivered Monday to Friday.

Wheelchairs and other small items can be hired for a nominal fee.

Our **cryptic crossword club** meets on Monday downstairs and the **Knit and Natter group** meet monthly at Springhill Court.

For those wanting to meet others we have our regular **Tea and Tarts** get together in the Galtres Centre between 10am and noon, free to attend, all welcome. Enjoy cakes and tea/coffee. **The next Tea and Tarts is on 12th August.**
