

# From Rev'd Richard Grant



Dear All,

Christmas is coming! Advent is here, the beginning of a new church year is upon us, and the countdown has begun. Advent candles will be lit, calendar doors will be opened, and carols will be sung. Thinking of carols – I wonder what your favourite carol is?

I find it hard to pick a favourite, but one advent carol I'm very fond of is 'O come, O come, Emmanuel', which includes this fantastic verse:

O come, Thou Dayspring, from on high,
And cheer us by Thy drawing nigh;
Disperse the gloomy clouds of night,
And death's dark shadows put to flight.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
Shall come to thee, O Israel.

It's a cracker of a hymn, rooted deeply in the bible, and it ties in particularly with one of my favourite Christmas bible readings, from the gospel of John: 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.'

This is a tricky time of year for many: The nights definitely feel like they're closing in, and the festive joy of the nation can sometimes serve to highlight our own pain, sorrow, and loss. If that's something you are experiencing, then I hope you will find some comfort in the promise that 'the darkness has not overcome'. Just as in less than a month the days will start to get longer and the nights shorter, we are promised in Christ a better time to come. A time when we will be reunited with those we have loved and lost, a time when pain will be no more, a time when the darkness will not even be a distant memory.

We all approach Christmas differently, but I hope that each one of you will experience Christ's presence in this season. My prayer is that we would all experience light in the darkness, know joy this Christmas, and grow in love for one another and for the God whose incarnation we celebrate.

History of Christingle: Christingle services have been taking place for over 50 years. The first Christingle took place at Lincoln Cathedral in 1968, but Christingles themselves go back much further to the Moravian church in Germany. At a children's service in Marienborn in 1747, Bishop Johannes de Watteville looked for a simple way to explain the happiness that had come to people through Jesus, and created a symbol – the Christingle – to do this. Each element of a Christingle has a special meaning and helps to tell the Christian story.

The orange represents the world

The red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love and blood of Christ

The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations

The candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness


tastes for fresh cream or ice-cream.

# Why Not Pray?

In the parable of the judge and the widow (Luke 18:1-8) we learn something about prayer. The widow is persistent in her seeking justice and in the end the judge gives in and grants her request. If even such a respectless man can do the right thing in the end, how much more might our actual prayers affect the



course of history, the course of our lives? Prayer changes us. If we don't lose heart, it's the way we keep seeking after God's own heart, the way we keep channels of communication open between us and God. The parable is a plea to keep praying, even when it seems we are shouting into a vacuum. It's a plea not to get stuck in hopelessness, but to keep going, keep trusting, keep praying. God is not the unjust judge. God is God, who hears our prayers and draws closer and closer to us through them. We might not know the best outcome as we move forward in life, but God does.

# Anna Chaplaincy – What is it?



It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!
